<u>Call Meeting to Order:</u> Handy called the meeting to order at approximately 6:00 pm at the Garfield Township Hall, 3848 Veterans Drive, Traverse City MI 49684.

#### 1. Review and Approval of the Agenda – Conflict of Interest

No conflict of interest was noted. Kroupa moved THAT the agenda be approved as presented. Remy seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

#### 2. Election of Officers (PD-2017-18)

Kroupa moved THAT Chris Remy be elected as Chair of the Parks and Recreation commission. Remy seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Kroupa moved THAT Valerie Handy be appointed as Vice-Chair of the Parks and Recreation commission. Remy seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Kroupa moved THAT Dale Majerczyk be elected Secretary of the Parks and Recreation commission. Handy seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

#### 3. Review and Approval of Meeting Minutes-October 26, 2016

Kroupa moved THAT the minutes be approved as presented. Spence seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

#### 4. <u>Correspondence:</u>

Grand Traverse Conservation District Reports for January and February were received. Tom Vitale stated that there is a work bee planned for Miller Creek on April 12, 2017.

#### 5. Reports:

- a. <u>Buffalo Ridge Trail/Student Partnership:</u> Tom Vitale shared that the Conservation District has partnered with the TC West advance science class in submitting a grant to the TC Track Club for funds to assist with the placement of a trail connector.
- **b.** <u>Miller Creek Update:</u> Handy stated she met with Tom Vitale to discuss necessary improvements for Miller Creek. The Parks and Recreation board last year

requested funding for the trail improvement and the floating dock. In December, the Township Board indicated any item over \$10,000 will need to come before the Board. Tom provided a copy of the bid sheet for the fishing platform which the Commission asked Vitale to provide pricing for both timber and metal. He added the SEEDS bid was still valid for the boardwalk. Larrea suggested that he and Vitale meet to discuss budget requests.

#### 6. Business to come before the Commission:

#### a. PD-2017-13 Review of Parks Commission By-Laws

Commissioners were provided a copy of the existing by-laws. A recommendation was made by staff to address what constitutes a quorum. Kroupa moved THAT Section 3: Meetings (F) Quorum- state "a quorum constitutes a majority of parks and recreation commission membership present". Handy seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

#### b. PD-01716-BNVP Update.

Staff presented the site plan and cost estimates prepared by Prein Newhof for the BVNP improvements. Larrea noted that the project is on schedule.

#### 7. Commissioner Comment

Handy updated the commission on the Hickory Hills Task Force meeting and stated she had met with Todd Lewis regarding possible reimbursement for the improvements made at Silver Lake Recreation area for the proposed disc golf course. Larrea added that the commission will have to address the Parks and Recreation plan that will be expiring at the end of this year.

#### 8. Other Business

None.

#### 9. Items for next agenda

2017 Commission Goals: The commission indicated their desire to focus on updating the Master Plan, improvements for Miller Creek, Templeton and Kids Creek, preparation of an operational budget, the State 40 and trail improvements. Larrea indicated that he and Tom Vitale will discuss these items at their meeting.

Beacon Hills Signage Request: Mike Steadman was in the audience and indicated that he would like to have the waterfront property owned by the Township located in Beacon Hills signed like other parks. Commission members stated that other property owned by Garfield Township on the waterfront should be signed as well.

Silver Lake Park Request for Consideration (Ice Rink placement)

Future Meeting Dates: Larrea would like to see the commission meet monthly rather than quarterly as there is a lot on the agenda for 2017. Staff will try and coordinate with other users of the meeting room to find a specific date and time each month that will work.

Dear Mr. Majercyck:

My name is Doug Brown. My wife Edie and I live on Silver Lake between the Public Access site and the Beacon Hills Subdivision Park. We have lived here since 1980 and have seen firsthand the growth of boating on the lake.

We have become increasingly concerned about the safety of swimmers, paddleboard users and boaters in the area in and around the Public Access site. Watercraft of various types, Personal Watercraft and boats, approach the area at a high rate of speed and don't slow down as they pass through this area that is many times congested. I am not aware of any injuries so far, but we have witnessed many near misses.

Late last summer we were with two separate groups of subdivision residents who shared our concerns over the safety of the people in that area. The consensus was that creating a No-Wake Zone in that area would greatly help to mitigate the problem. There is a natural point just to the right of the Public Access site and the end of peninsula that contains Harbor Dr. that could easily define the No Wake area. (See attached map)

We ask that you call a Public Hearing on this matter so that the Township would be in a position to request the DNR to create such a zone.


We plan to attend your meeting on April 10th to continue this discussion.


#### STAFF COMMENT

#### **BACKGROUND**

In late 2016, discussions regarding the Miller Creek fishing platform centered on purchasing a non-timber removable floating dock. Bids were provided and previously considered however, it does not appear that a decision materialized on the bids. Following discussion at the March 21, 2017 PRC meeting there was a consensus that we seek an estimate from SEEDS to construct a permanent timber fishing platform similar to those constructed at our other parks.

#### STAFF COMMENT

- 1. This proposal will be considered null and void if project authorization is not received within 30 days of the date of proposal.
- 2. The Client hereby authorizes the above-described services and agrees to pay SEEDS at the stated price unless another basis of charge is indicated. The Client will pay SEEDS for work outlined above. The Client will be invoiced and, except as noted within these terms and conditions, payment is due within 30 days of the date of invoice. A service charge of 1.5% per month will be added to past due accounts. Accounts 30 days past due are subject to the Michigan Mechanic's Lien Law.
- 3. Client agrees to pay SEEDS within thirty (30) days after receipt of an invoice.
- 4. SEEDS agrees to perform in accordance with a standard of care generally exercised by other environmental and facilitation consultants within this state acting under similar circumstances and conditions.

- 7. SEEDS will use reasonable efforts to maintain confidentiality and not divulge information regarding the proposal, services or its report, except to the Client, parties designated by the Client in writing, or as required by law. Information that is in the public domain shall not be deemed confidential.
- 8. Client in no way grants SEEDS, its employees, consultants, agents, representatives, contractors and subcontractors, for the purpose of performing all activities, studies and research the right at any time to enter the Site
- SEEDS and the Client agree that acceptance by SEEDS of its responsibility under this agreement does not in any way impose upon SEEDS the obligations, responsibility, or liabilities of an owner or operator of the Site.

- 10. The Client and SEEDS recognize that professional standards and ethics govern the performance of SEEDS' services under this agreement. If circumstances arise which, in SEEDS' opinion, preclude it for professional or ethical reasons from continuing such performance, SEEDS shall advise the Client of that fact. The parties shall immediately attempt to arrive at a mutually satisfactory solution. If this cannot be done to both parties' satisfaction, either party may terminate this agreement. If so, the Client shall compensate SEEDS in accordance with these terms and conditions.
- 11. The Client bears full responsibility for any fines, penalties or administrative actions that may be incurred due to non-compliance with Federal or State reporting requirements that may be the results of any delays or actions by the Client or any suspension or termination of performance between the Client and SEEDS as defined within these terms and conditions.

Suspension of performance for a period exceeding 30 days for any reason, shall at the sole option of SEEDS result in termination or renegotiation of project scope of work, services provided, terms and conditions, schedule, and estimated costs prior to renewal of project activities and services. All suspensions shall extend the time schedule for performance in a mutually satisfactory manner, but at a minimum, the extension shall equal the duration of the suspension.
- 13. The Client, at its sole discretion, may terminate, upon ten days written notice, the authorized project or any subsequent change order. SEEDS may, at its sole discretion and upon 10 days prior written notice, may terminate the authorized project or any subsequent change order.






