5. Reports

a. Grand Traverse Metro Fire Department Report (6:04)

Terry Flynn reported that there were a couple fires in the township over the past few weeks and that it had been a busy month. Calls in the region were up by 10% over last year and figures for mutual aid will be addressed.

b. County Commissioner's Report (6:06)

Christine Maxbauer reported that Committee on Aging ballot request for a millage renewal would be discussed by the full board next week.

c. Personnel Committee Report (6:07)

No report

d. Clerk's Report (6:07)

Schumacher said that 790 absentee ballots have been received and that she would like to sign an agreement for a CPA accounting firm to come from Wexford County one day a month at a cost of \$75 per hour and \$35 per hour travel time. The board reached a consensus and agreed to the request.

e. Supervisor's Report (6:10)

Korn reported that he is keeping busy with the County's water and sewer projects.

6. Unfinished Business (6:10)

a. Public Hearing - PD 2014-46 - Buffalo Ridge Center PUD - 3639 **Marketplace Circle**

The proposed Buffalo Ridge PUD is located on 34.41 acres and is zoned C-2 General Business District. The application proposes a commercial redevelopment Planned Unit Development project that will preserve several acres of sensitive wetlands. The redevelopment of the northern half of the existing outlet mall will include a 14 screen movie theater, an additional commercial building, and parking areas. The south half of the development will remain in its present state until future redevelopment opportunities are explored and proper applications made. The Planning Commission recommended approval to the Board on June 11, 2014. Doug Mansfield is representing the owners of the Carmike Theater project and introduced several key people working on the project. Mansfield said that all existing connecting drives will remain and the project also includes a trail extension along US 31. All municipal entities have approved the plans and they have met all expectations of governing agencies and their goals and objectives. Jim Scales, attorney for Buffalo Ridge, said that every issue raised by the Grand Traverse Mall had been dealt with by Township officials. The Findings of Fact show that the PUD meets all standards. He added that the proposed PUD is a good use of the property and meets all intents and purposes of a PUD.

Korn opened the Public Hearing at 6:22pm.

Pat Heintz of Bishop and Heintz, spoke on behalf of the Grand Traverse Mall. He stated that he was concerned that there was no traffic study required by the Planning Commission for the proposed Buffalo Ridge PUD, yet the Grand Traverse Mall had to complete an extensive traffic study for approval. Mr. Heintz stated that they commissioned a limited traffic analysis on the proposed PUD and stated that the Findings of Fact could not be adopted based on the traffic studies results. Heintz also disapproved of the proposed project's stormwater plan being deferred to the township engineer for review, and that no bond was required for the proposed PUD. Heintz further stated that this PUD should be subject to the same standards that the Grand Traverse Mall was held to when it was built.

Clive Johnson from Gosling Czubak, stated that he was contracted by the Grand Traverse Mall to look into the stormwater system for Buffalo Ridge and had concerns with the current system.

Dick Bon Sallette, a resident of Creekside Condominiums said that there is no catch basin that overflows and sees no issues with the stormwater sstem as stated by Mr. Johnson. He added that the easement between Creekside and the Mall needs to remain open.

Attorney Jim Scales said that comparisons to the Grand Traverse Mall are not accurate. Buffalo Ridge is only a proposed redevelopment of a piece of property. Grand Traverse Mall was built from the ground up, thus there were many more requirements for approval. There is no need for a traffic study in this proposed redevelopment and the Grand Traverse Mall is simply trying to delay the project because of movie theater competition. He said that the trail is being provided as part of the conditions and that stormwater can be dealt with after approval in the permit process. There is no need for a market study since the project is located in a large scale commercial area and is already an existing shopping area. Preserving the access to Kohl's is a condition of approval.

Korn closed the Public Hearing at 6:54pm.

Board members discussed the issue. Some Board members spoke to residents and many said that there was no problem with the project since it was only upgrading what was already in place. Wilson said that the Planning Commission worked hard, did their homework and followed the law in every aspect of this project. There is a letter from MDOT stating that a traffic study was not required to access US 31 and the township engineer is working with the applicant on the storm water review, which is common. Township Attorney Peter Doren told the board that if there was sufficient information and evidence presented by the applicant and the staff, they could make a decision and adopt the Findings of Fact. He does not believe that an amendment made during the process requires the applicant to reapply. He read the letter from MDOT dated July 22, 2014 into

the record and it is attached. Doren said that the Board could ask for further traffic studies but found no defects in the process. The board agreed that they were reluctant to see concerns with traffic since it is a redevelopment of an existing shopping area. The township engineer continues to work with the applicant's engineer to review and upgrade the stormwater system and final approval is required as part of the permitting phase.

Wilson moved and Schmuckal seconded THAT the Proposed Findings of Fact for Planned Unit Development Application #2014-02, Buffalo Ridge Center dated July 22, 2014 BE APPROVED.

Wilson moved and Schmuckal seconded THAT the Township Board authorize a Special Use Permit for Planned Unit Development Application #2014-02, Buffalo Ridge Center, for the reasons set forth in the adopted Findings of Fact, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Prior to the issuance of building or land use permits, all necessary reviews and permits shall be obtained from agencies with jurisdiction, and all conditions of approval shall be met.
- 2. Approval is subject to Planning Department review and approval of final site plans indicating compliance with all provisions of the zoning ordinance, with all conditions of approval, with the representations made in the application materials, and with the adopted Findings of Fact.
- 3. The asphalt bike path along US-31 shall be constructed to a width of 10 feet and shall be constructed within one (1) year of the date of project approval. Any stream crossing shall be constructed by way of a bridge or bottomless span. Construction of the pathway and all wetland and stream crossings is subject to DEQ approval. A performance bond or letter of credit in an amount 10% over the estimated pathway construction cost shall be provided to the Township prior to the issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy for the theater.
- 4. The pervious path to connect to the Creekside subdivision shall be connected of crushed limestone and shall be regularly maintained by Buffalo Ridge Center.
- Internal sidewalks shall be constructed of raised, curbed concrete so as to limit vehicle intrusion with the walkway. Site plans shall be updated accordingly.
- 6. Buffalo Ridge Center shall regularly maintain (stripe/paint) the bike lanes and crosswalks so that such are clearly visible and understood to function for that purpose.
- 7. Prior to the issuance of any land use or building permits the Applicant shall have protected the sensitive wetland areas with a conservation easement acceptable to the township.
- 8. Trees that are to be retained shall be appropriately marked and protected

- prior to and throughout site construction.
- 9. All signs shall require Planning Commission approval. Approval of the present application does not include any sort of sign approval regardless of signs being shown on structure elevations or site plans.
- 10. All existing connections to adjacent properties shall remain open.
- 11. The hours of operation for snow removal, other parking lot maintenance, trash removal, and truck deliveries including the parking of idling trucks on the West and South sides of boundaries of the PUD shall be limited to the hours of 6:00am to 11:00 pm except in emergency situations. Equipment operation shall be in such a manner as to minimize back-up beepers, the operation of large engines and heavy equipment which will disrupt the night time peace and serenity of adjoining neighbors.
- 12. Buffalo Ridge Center will prepare and file a "best management practices program" for maintaining parking lots and storm drainage systems associated with the project so as to minimize the potential for contamination of stormwater and shall implement such program on a regular and continuing basis. Such plan and compliance with it shall be subject to review and approval by the Township Engineer.
- 13. The applicant shall record promptly the Report and Decision Order (RDO) and any amendment to such order with the Grand Traverse County Register of Deeds in the chain of title for each parcel or portion thereof to which the RDO pertains. Alternatively, a Memorandum of RDO may be prepared by the Township in such recordable form as deemed appropriate and shall then be recorded promptly by the applicant with the Grand Traverse County Register of Deeds. A copy of each recorded document shall be filed with the Township within ninety (90) days of final approval by the Township or approval shall be considered to have expired. No land use permits shall be issued until all recorded documents have been provided to the Township.
- 14. The PUD is subject to representations and other matters consistent with the application, as amended and clarified, and supporting materials.
- 15. That the Township Board authorizes the Planning Director to prepare the Report and Decision Order consistent with the motion and to be brought back to the Township Board for approval.

Jim Johnson – County Road Commission – LaFranier Road Project (7:20) Jim Johnson, from the Grand Traverse County Road Commission, was present to answer any questions that the board may have regarding the LaFranier Road project. The hill, which is currently a 12% grade, is proposed to be rebuilt to an 8% grade. Accesses to neighborhoods will be affected in that area due to the grade change. Contingencies are built into the costs and according to state funding guidelines, the project needs to be completed by end of next year. The funding timeline was discussed as well as turn lanes and a pedestrian pathway. The Road Commission is proposing a three way split for the monetary portion not funded by the state which would be approximately \$370,000 each for the township, the county and the road commission.

Wilson moved and Schmuckal seconded to fund an equal monetary match with Grand Traverse County and the Grand Traverse County Road Commission.

Construction Update

Water Projects

Northwest Service District - Water System Improvements

The overall need for the project is beginning with intentions for Brookide Development to start in the next couple months and pressure problems becoming exacerbated with the irrigation season. The acquisition of property is underway along with immediate installation of some utilities as other entities are doing work in areas where proposed watermain are planned. GFA is working on a schedule for the overall project with our goal to have piping, tank and booster station completed by December 2015.

Zimmerman Road

The Township board provided authorization to GFA to coordinate installation of the proposed 16" watermain consecutive with the Grand Traverse Road Commission Road Improvements project. Negotiations with the GTCRC contractor Elmer's has occurred and prices provided were consistent with current bid prices for the area. GFA is working diligently to complete design, drawings / specifications, permits and coordination with all parties.

The road project was intended to be completed prior to school being back in session, however with this opportunity to coordinate projects both the Township and GTCRC have agreed to work together to complete by November 1st. The watermain installation is scheduled to begin around August 25th with road improvements to start approximately a month later.

Brookside

The proposed development is installing utilities along North Long Lake / Zimmerman Road that is consistent with locations the Township needs to install a parallel watermain. There is potential to coordinate work and cost savings to have utilities installed at same time. GFA is working with developer conducting plan reviews and assisting with Twp utility layout and permits.

Eaglehurst and Crown Development

Some of the residents are experiencing significant pressure fluctuations and low pressure as a direct result of significant system usage this summer. The proposed NW water project will alleviate these problems but is 18 months until completion. In the interim GFA is working with the DPW to perform some operation and control modifications at SilverPines Booster Station #3 and Herkner Booster Station #5 to reduce the occurrence.

General Utilities

Pineview Sewer Extension

Final pay application and change order are in the packet for approval. CJs completed the project including restoration in April. GFA has received closeout documents and completing record drawings and will deliver to the DPW and Township acceptance.

Lafranier Road

GFA is working with the GTCRC with plan reviews, cost estimates with respect to the utility adjustments. The lowering of the hill will affect a 12" forcemain and 8" sewer and the primary 20" watermain that feeds the eastern side of Garfield Township.

Pump Station #3

DPW has been continuing to maintain this 25 year old station but is extreme need of pump replacements, electrical / instrumentation upgrades. The Township had pursued SAW Grant money to assist but was not selected during the lottery process. Cost estimates for the work have been provided to the Township for the rehabilitation.

GRAND TRAVERSE METRO FIRE DEPARTMENT 2015 BUDGET ASSUMPTIONS/ISSUES

Preliminary - 2.2 mils

Below are assumptions/issues for the 2015 Budget:

- 1) 1.78% increase in Townships real property taxable valuations.

 (at 2.1 mils, this impact is approx \$55,147 of additional revenue from Townships in 2015).
- 2) Wages and Benefits
 - * Wage increases for firefighters, administrative and fire inspectors
 - * Budgeted 20% increase in health insurance premiums
 - * Increase PT FF hourly rate by \$0.75. Effective 9/1/14, Michigan minimum wage will increase by \$0.75/hour.
- 3) Purchase pick-up truck for Station #1 out of PIF funds to use as a pull/utility vehicle.
- 4) In 2015, payments for Tanker 12 Cherryland loan will be paid out of the Public Improvement Fund (\$62,492) (same as in 2013 and 2014).
- 5) Lease payment for Engine 8 is \$99,500 per year out of the General Fund. (purchased 2013)
- 6) \$68,000 of new debt is budgeted for in 2015. This consists of 1/2 year payments for new Station 8 debt of \$2.0 million at 3.2% for 20 years. Annually this payment equates to approx. \$136,000 or .09 mils.
- 7) 2015 Budget represents the 4th year in a row that GT Metro will not be allocating funds for future growth of the department.
- 8) The budget presented results in a millage of 2.35 mils in order to have a balanced budget. Adjusting the millage to 2.2 mils results in a (\$232,396) loss
- 9) To hold the tax increase to 2.2 mils, it is the recommendation of the GT Metro Board to ask the Townships to contribute a maximum of \$232,396 to reduce the impact of the 2015 budgeted loss.

STAFF COMMENT:

The 2014 Parks budget included \$10,000.00 to install two drinking water sources within the dog park at the Silver Lake Rec Area, which was established late last year. One drinking source each will be installed within the small dog and large dog enclosures. Drinking sources are known to make a dog park more safe and enjoyable to dogs and their owners, and the Park Commission anticipated this need in the 2014 budget.

Bill Mouser has received bids for the project, which includes running a water line from the restroom, removal and replacement of some concrete sidewalk, pouring concrete pads which include floor drains and drainstone, and finally installing the drinking fixtures themselves.

Cost estimates for the fountains are as follows:

- MDF Fountain: \$1,610 delivered for two "jug fillers." Park users will bring their own bowls for their pet. The valves are auto-shut off and won't be able to be left open. This company offers a vandal-resistant option that adds \$420.00 to the cost for a total of \$2,230 if the option is selected. This fixture can be installed on a "plate" mounted to the concrete pad, leading to easier future maintenance or replacement as necessary.
- Kay Fountain: \$1,703.00 delivered for two jug fillers similar to the above, but lacking the vandal-resistant feature. This fixture is set in the concrete pad, leading to more difficult future maintenance or replacement.

Cost estimates for labor are as follows:

- Alpers Excavating: \$8,725.00 to conduct all work except for drinking fountain installation.
- Walters & Hemming: \$25,609.00 to conduct all work above, and also including purchase and installation of two fountains.

Though this project was budgeted, Board approval is required because the cost exceeds \$5,000.00. Staff's recommendation is to accept the Alpers Excavating bid, and to separately purchase the two MDF Fountain fixtures including the vandal-resistant option, which Bill will install. The total cost as recommended totals \$10,955.00, over the budgeted \$10,000.00. However, a springtime project to extend the sprinkler system to the dog park came in \$1,501.00 under budget, which may be used to make up for the shortfall.

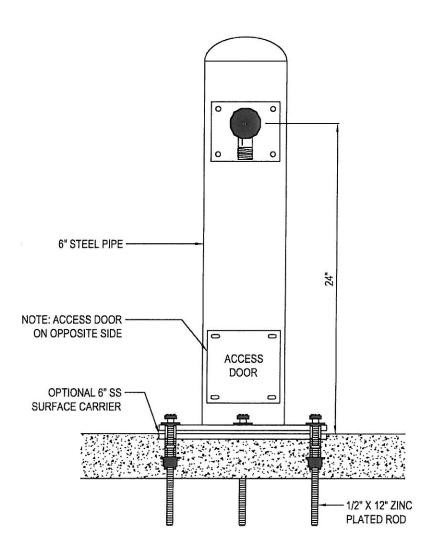
